From simple back to school to contact logs and weekly check-ins to self-grading quizzes, Forms is my go-to -- and it will soon be yours, too. Participants will learn how to create a form, add questions and content, and complete challenges.

Session 4: Choice Boards & Hyperdocs Extended

Participants will explore examples of Choice Boards & Hyperdocs, review best practices, and receive multiple templates to use. This session includes an additional fifteen minutes of building Choice Boards or Hyperdocs and Q&A
