Trauma-Informed Classroom Management

Childhood trauma can have lifelong impacts on development, but a trauma-informed learning environment can help to buffer these impacts and help children heal and grow. How can we incorporate the growing body of knowledge and research on trauma into our day-to-day classroom practices?

The area of classroom management is rich with opportunities to help students develop social-emotional skills and build community. In this workshop, we'll look at the underlying philosophies and assumptions behind "traditional" classroom management and how a trauma-informed approach responds to those assumptions.

In this workshop we will:

- Review the basic concepts of trauma-informed education
- Focus on four priorities of a trauma-informed classroom
- Evaluate our current classroom management practices through a traumainformed lens
- Compare and contrast classroom behavior theories
- Identify areas in our practice for further action/research

Teachers will leave this workshop with a personalized action/research plan. At the follow-up afternoon workshop, participants will have the opportunity to reflect on their practice, share their learning, and identify next steps.
